



SAL SALIS NINGALOO REEF

DRIVE DIRECTIONS FROM EXMOUTH

There is no signage at the Mandu South car park and guests need to call our camp prior to departing Exmouth so we can have one of our team waiting at the car park to transfer your luggage.

Camp Number – 08 9949 4173.

If you have ***not*** phoned ahead to confirm your arrival time, and you arrive at the Mandu South car park to find nobody is waiting, please walk south along either the well-worn bush track or the beach to the camp. Bring only your valuables and leave the car locked. You do not need to carry your luggage into the camp we have a solar powered buggy and will collect it from your car for you.

Sal Salis is 66 kms from the town of Exmouth and the drive will take about 45 minutes. If you are driving in the evening or the early morning please go very slowly as there is a huge number of kangaroos in the area and sadly collisions are all too frequent.

Head north out of town and after about 15 minutes you will take a turn to the left. This road is sign posted to Cape Range National Park and is called Yardie Creek Rd. Continue along this road, past the lighthouse and a caravan park; eventually it will turn to the south on the western side of the peninsula.

You will need to stop at the Rangers Station to pay \$12 for your car to enter the National Park. You do not need to pay the per person park fee as this is included in your room rate and we pay this directly to National Parks. If there is no Ranger at the Ranger Station you should stop anyway as there is a safe box in which you can drop the \$12 fee along with a note detailing your car number plate etc.

Keep heading south, pass the Millyering Visitors Information Centre and eventually on the right you will see Turquoise Bay car park, followed by the Mandu North car park and almost immediately after the Mandu South car park.

Park your car in the Mandu South car park (it is exactly 5kms from the Turquoise Bay car park). A staff member will meet you on arrival and will walk with you along the well-worn foot path heading south into the dunes. The walk into camp from the car park is approximately 800 metres. Your luggage will be transported by our buggy.

Please note that lunch is not included on your arrival day. There is a good selection of restaurants and cafes in Exmouth town. Our recommendations are The Potshot Hotel, Sea Salt or Blue Lips Fish & Chips Cafe.



Sal Salis Ningaloo Reef operates under the Department of Parks and Wildlife (DPaW). Due to abundant wildlife on and around the roads during dawn or dusk, it is prohibited by the national parks to drive during hours with no light. Please advise in advance if your vehicle will be a caravan or if you will have a trailer, as we need to have it registered with the Park and DaPW.

Check-in time is at 2.00pm – Check-out is at 11.00am

Note: Please note there is a 'no pet policy' at Sal Salis Ningaloo Reef. Guests should also note that feeding of wildlife is not permitted.

Important:

Please advise in advance if you are towing a caravan or trailer, as we need to advise the National Parks if these vehicle types will be staying in the park overnight. Guests who self-drive to camp are asked to check their footwear on arrival at the South Mandu car park to ensure that they are not bringing any seeds into the camp and surrounding country. Guests are also asked not to feed any of the animals in the park, as this goes against all principles of wildlife management in a natural area.



On the left you can see you are driving up around the Cape and on the right you can see that it is one continuous road, from the Airport through the town and on to the north.

If you are looking for banks, cafes and grocery stores etc turn left at Maidstone Crescent as you go into town (the white crescent road on the right hand map).
